blocks

your child will line them up, stack them, and knock them down

books

picture books of animals, cars, places, and everyday things; books with rhymes

music

simple songs and nursery rhymes; songs with finger and hand movements

objects

plastic containers to stack, nest, fill up, and empty; lids, blocks, simple puzzles, and things with different shapes

pretend

dolls, stuffed animals, old clothes, blankets, pretend adult items (toy phone, kitchen tools)

touch and feel things

containers they can fill up and empty, soft cloth, sticky things, cold things, sand, rice

Your child learns:

- how to use their hands
- what happens when they hit the blocks
- how to build things
- how to put things in order

Your child learns:

- to listen as you read
- the sound of words
- to say their first word

Your child learns:

- to recognize sounds and rhythms
- to imitate sounds and hand movements (clapping, patty cake, bye-bye)

Your child learns:

- how each part works
- that some things fit into other things
- that some things fit on top of other things

- how to act
- how other people and animals act

Your child learns:

- more about this world through feeling and touching
- more about hard and soft, wet and dry, empty and full
